Sri Lanka-So beautiful and so diverse?

This autumn issue of the four seasons e-mag is circulated by Lanka Expat Services for your reading pleasure with news and events happening in Sri Lanka as the coming winter approaches. Sri Lanka has been known as a country for its 8 species on the red list, when it was known as Ceylon. Now we know that, it has become famous for its sun & sand, cultural heritage, wildlife and the amazing diversity. The island is home to the largest mammals in Asia, birds and dragonflies and butterflies and many endemic species of fauna and flora as well as one of the best hot spots to see the blue whales in the world, and

of course the list goes on. Sri Lanka has a high density of bird species, considering the size of the island. It is said to harbour 227 resident bird species, including 76 endemic resident birds found only in the shores of Sri Lanka. With the migration species recorded from the island, the number increases to over 450. Sri Lanka is identified as an Endemic Bird Area (EBA) and the number of endemic species present in the EBA is the highest in Asia. While birds could be seen throughout the year November to April is considered the best period to see the birds in the island, especially the endemic species, when the south-west part of the island which is the southernmost country is clearly dry. Magnificent Sri Pada!

Ayurvedic Vanu Kalu Welcome!

The "Sri Pada" season begins in December from the full moon Undarapoya and goes on till the full moon Vesak poya in May. People trek the mountain all year round, however, the rainy season does not see many pilgrims. Known as the only mountain in the world considered sacred by the followers of the four major faiths in the world – Buddhists, Hindus, Christians and Muslims. To the Buddhists, the sunrise at the summit of the mountain is the hollowed footprint of the Buddha, hence the name "Sri Pada". To the Hindus, the footprint is that of God Shiva. To the Christians, it is the footprint of St Thomas, and to the Muslims, it is the

Also known as the hilly mountain, usually called the "Rammalai Kanda" due to the endless blocks of boulders that run their way to the summit with the start of the season. The boulders that made the seas long time ago during the season has divided in number due to urbanisation as their habitats have been cut down.

The trek up the mountain is 2220m and the pilgrims start their climb in the early hours of the morning as it takes about 2 ½ to 3 hours and will take them to the top in time to see the amazing sunrise. At the top of the peak the pilgrims worship the Sri Pada, and make their offerings.

Geographically Adam's Peak is important as the main watershed of Sri Lanka. Four of the principal rivers of the island, River Mahaweli, River Kalu, River Kala and River Walawe, originate from the beautiful Sri Pada mountain system, giving the Midland to the people of Sri Lanka. Adam's Peak is located in the district that boasts of precious minerals where stones such as sapphires, rubies & blue sapphires are found in abundance. For which the island has been famous, and which has earned its ancient name of "Ratnadvipa".

We invite you to make this lifetime experience to one of the most amazing places on earth. It is a truly magnificent journey.
